## Lee Township

Special Meeting June 5, 2012

The Regular Meeting of the Lee Township Board was called to order at 7:30 pm at the Lee Township Hall located at 877 56th Street, Pullman, Michigan.

Members Present: Trustee Black, Trustee Ferguson, Treasurer Lowery, Supervisor Miller and Clerk King.

The purpose of the Special Meeting was to discuss and determine the most effective way to use the road millage fund to fix as much the deteriorating roads in Lee Township. Larry Brown from the Allegan County Road Commission was present to help guide the board with the necessary details regarding cost for the different roads discussed. With the use of the recommendation report from the Road Committee discussion took place on what was the most effective way to stretch the dollars that have been allocated for the road.

The cost for such projects can run from \$22,000.00 for chip and seal to over \$120,000 per mile for 2" of new asphalt. Many of the roads on the list were discussed, but it was decided that the worst road were

- 103<sup>rd</sup> from 50<sup>th</sup> to 52<sup>nd</sup> Street (1 mile)
- 58<sup>th</sup> Street south 109<sup>th</sup> to 105<sup>th</sup> (2 miles)
- $105^{th}$  from  $53^{rd}$  to  $56^{th}$  (1 ½ mile)

During the discussion, there were many factors considered such as; the number of residents on the road, the amount of traffic, the condition of the road and the length which determines the cost. Larry Brown commended the proposed choice and felt that they would full under the amount of millage money collect. The amount collected was roughly \$116,000.00 and should be sufficient for the proposed road projects.

Action will be taken at the next regular board meeting on June 11, 2012.

Citizens Comments: Questions were asked regarding the mowing. Will a additional mowing be done? In the past the township has only done 1 mowing, which is paid by the county. Larry will get the cost of an additional mowing. A suggestion was also given to the Road Commission to better place the detour signs so that there is plenty of warning before the work area.

A motion was made by Miller and seconded by Black to adjourn the meeting at 7:20 pm. All voted "Aye". Motion carried.
