CONGRATULATIONS TO THE 2023 DEE WESBEY PULLMAN PRIDE SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS


Lee Township awarded 3 High School students the 2023 Pullman Pride scholarship. Congratulations to all Lee Twp. graduates as you go on to pursue your dreams.

Juanita Martinez-Martinez was awarded a \$1000 scholarship. Juanita is a Bloomingdale HS graduate who plans to attend MSU to study Social Work and Policial Science. Juanita shared in her essay that it wasn't until she started volunteering at the Linking Center that she found appreciation for the diversity in her community. "Being there made me grow emotionally, spiritually and



personally in truly amazing ways. Being consistent in the kids' lives is not just about showing up everyday, its about creating bonds and growing alongside them."

Stephos Georgiou was awarded a \$750 scholarship. Stephos is a Bloomingdale HS graduate who plans to attend Cornerstone University to study Business and Marketing and participate on their wrestling team. Stephos noted in his essay that when he moved to Pullman in 5th grade he immediately felt a sense of belonging he had been searching for. He attributes much of his personal growth



to his teacher Mr. Visscher, through his guidance and connecting him to sports where he would excel. COMMUNITY PRIDE BEGINS IN OUR FRONT YARD

Blight, litter and abandoned cars are the number one complaint to the Township. Just because the township does not have zoning doesn't mean there are no regulations set for the good of all. Lee Township ordinances (can be viewed on the twp. website www.leetwp.org) spell out guidelines for all residents to comply with. A safe and healthy living environment is a basic right for each of us.

To assist residents in this effort, the Township continues to provide each taxpayer with 2 free dump tickets to use at the Transfer Station. In addition, <u>3 Free Dump Days are offered for Lee Township residents (April 22, June 17, and Sept. 16.</u> World Clean-Up Day is celebrated September 16,2 023. Let's all do our part.

Here are some brief reminders taken from local ordinances:

- Trash & Leaf Burning Ordinance #2013 Section 2 describes requirements for trash and leaf burning. Remember to call 269-686-5222 for burn permit, burn in designated areas set forth in ordinance, and be sure your burn container meets requirements.
- Litter Ordinance #2022 Section 2 defines "Litter" as all garbage, scrap, and waste material, inoperable appliances and equipment, brush, discarded concrete, brick or building materials or any other loose or discarded articles. Section 3 clearly explains no dumping or leaving trash on public or private property.
- Blight Ordinance #2025 Section 3 defines blight factors (similar to items listed above under Litter Ordinance with more detail) and prohibitions along with maximum time these types of items can be left sitting out (not to exceed 15 days). This ordinance incudes any vacant dwelling, garage or outbuilding unless they are kept securely locked, windows glazed or neatly boarded up and otherwise protected to prevent unauthorized entry as blight (Section 3D).
- Single Family Dwelling Ordinance #2026.2 Section 2 prohibits living in tents, campers, trailers, vehicles, or any other structure that does not meet the State of Michigan Building codes. This is a major area of concern for personal safety and public health.
- No residence can be constructed, moved in, or relocated within Lee Township without a permit from the building official (contact MTS at 269-673-3239).

Infrastructure Improvements to Downtown

A bit of an inconvenience for residents and travelers through Pullman as new storm drains are being replaced. The original drains installed in 1959 were failing. The Township had them mechanically cleaned about 10 years ago after sink holes were forming due to the collapse from sections of the culvert.

The Allegan County Road Commission project includes installing the new storm sewer along 56th Street both north and south of 109th Avenue. ACRC is coordinating with the County Drain Commis-



sion on the replacement storm sewer for the county drain to connect to the Scott Creek Drain. In addition left turn lanes will be added. curbs will installed and old sidewalks in disrepair will be fixed. Work is expected to continue throughout the summer. Please continue to follow posted detour signs.

2023 SUMMER TAX INFORMATION

We encourage mailing in your tax payment or putting check/money order payment in an envelope with your name and address in the drop slot at the Township office door. Receipts will be mailed if requested (write "mail receipt" on envelope). If paying by cash, the Treasurer will be in the office on Tuesdays and Fridays to accept cash payments. No change provided, so exact payment is required. Masks are encouraged for anyone entering the Township office.

The Treasurer will collect tax at the Township Office <u>Tuesdays</u> <u>and Fridays (9 am-3 pm)</u> the months of July, August and September. Interest will be added to taxes paid after <u>September 15th. POSTMARKS NOT HONORED</u>. Summer <u>Tax 2023</u> <u>must be paid to Lee Twp. Treasurer until February 29, 2024.</u>

<u>Summer deferment Form</u> may be filed to defer payment of interest on principal residence of persons 62 years of age or older or property that is classified or used as agricultural property until the time that winter taxes are due. Forms are available at the Township office, www.leetwp.org, and www.allegancounty.org. The form must be filed with the Township Treasurer by September 15, 2023.

Reminder Disabled Veterans Tax Exemption form must be submitted annually (note any special assessments do not apply to this exemption). Call the Township office or get the form from our website @ www.leetwp.org.

A Note from the Assessor: The Assessor has authorized the Board of Review to convene on <u>July 18th at 1:00pm.</u> July BOR is to correct any mutual mistake of fact or clerical errors on tax notice. Notify the Treasurer or Assessor of any necessary corrections upon receipt of tax bill.
