# 2020 WINTER TAX INFORMATION PLEASE NOTE CHANGES TO TAX COLLECTION

Due to the coronavirus, the following precautions are in place at the Township office for everyone's health and safety. We encourage mailing in your tax payment or putting check/money order payment in an envelope with your name and address in the drop slot at the Township office door. Receipts will be mailed if requested (write "mail receipt" on envelope). If paying by cash, the Treasurer will be in the office on Tuesdays and Fridays to accept cash payments. No change can be made so exact payment is required. Anyone entering the Township office must wear a mask. Arrangements for credit card payments can be made by calling the Treasurer and providing an email address. Additional charges apply.

Tax bills will be mailed by December 1<sup>st</sup>. Please check your bill upon receipt for possible errors. Errors may be corrected at the **December Board of Review, Tuesday December 15th at 2:30pm** at the **Township Hall.** 

The Treasurer will collect tax at the <u>Township Office</u> on <u>Tuesdays</u> (9am – 12pm) and Fridays (9am – 4pm) the months of December, January, and February. A 3% penalty will be added to winter tax paid after February 16, 2021. <u>Payment must be received by due</u> date, postmarks are not honored.

Unpaid Summer 2020 tax must be paid at the Township (interest added 1% per month beginning September 15, 2020). Beginning March 1, 2021, unpaid taxes (Summer & Winter) become delinquent and must be paid to the <u>ALLEGAN COUNTY TREASURER</u>, with an additional 4% penalty and 1.% interest per month. Verify the correct amount to be paid by contacting the County Treasurer's Office at 673-0260 or www.allegancounty.org.

### Defer penalty and interest

Qualifying senior citizens or permanently disabled persons may defer penalty and interest on tax payments until April 30<sup>th</sup> for **Homeowner's Principal Residence only**. Notify the Township Treasurer to apply for a **Deferment Application** at the receipt of your tax bill.

### **Ambulance Service**

Life EMS provides Lee Twp. ambulances service. Residents are encouraged to sign up in March for annual Lifecare+ membership online at **www.lifeems.com** and then click "Explore Memberships" at the bottom of the page. Annual cost per family is \$49 with supplemental insurance, or \$79 without insurance.
