#### FIRE PREVENTION

October was <u>Fire Prevention Month</u> and the Lee Township Fire Department gave Pullman Elementary School students a first-hand experience about the dangers of fighting fires and fire safety tips during a school assembly on November 1.

#### FIRE PREVENTION SAFETY TIPS

Decorations like dried flowers, corn stalks and Christmas trees are highly flammable. Keep these away from flames and heat sources. Every second counts during a fire. Experts say you have less than 2 minutes to escape a burning home. It is critical for you to have a family escape plan. Make sure all doors and windows that lead to outside are accessible and easy to open. Consider an escape ladder for sleeping areas located on the 2nd floor. Choose an outside meeting place for children and teach children how to escape on their own if you are unable to help them.

Smoke detectors have saved literally tens of thousands of lives, and prevented hundreds of thousands of injuries over the years. They are cheap, easy to install, and you can pick them up at hardware or home improvement stores. How many do you need? At a bare minimum, you need at least one for every level of your house. You should test your smoke detectors on a regular basis. Most smoke detectors have a button marked TEST, and you simply push it in. If the alarm sounds, it's fine. If it doesn't, either the detector has gone bad or the battery is worn out.

Please be sure your home has smoke detectors and your family has an emergency exit plan.

#### WINTER SAFETY TIPS

Be prepared and safe this winter season by

- \* testing your smoke alarms & carbon dioxide detectors
- \* having your chimney cleaned if you burn wood
- \* having a family evacuation plan with an outside meeting place in case of a fire
- \* not leaving electric heaters unattended
- cleaning out your dryer filters
- changing your furnace filter
- \* not using portable flameless chemical heaters indoors
- \* never using a generator inside your home, basement or garage or less than 20 feet from any window or door
- \* making sure your gas appliances are vented properly
- \* never heating your home with a gas range or oven
- \* never running a car or truck inside an attached garage.

## **Holiday Pet Safety Tips:**

- Keep "people food" away from your pet, and ask your guests to do the same.
- Make sure your pet doesn't have any access to treats, especially those containing chocolate, xylitol, grapes/raisins, onions or other toxic foods.
- Don't leave your pet alone in the room with lit candles, a decorated tree or potpourri.
- Keep holiday plants (especially holly & mistletoe) out of reach.
- Consider leaving the tinsel off your tree if you have a cat.
- Secure your Christmas tree to keep it from falling over if your dog bumps it or your cat climbs it. Hanging lemon-scented car air fresheners in the tree may deter your cat from climbing it.
- Provide a safe place for your pet to escape the excitement such as a crate, or another room if you're entertaining guests.
- Do not leave your pet outside during cold weather.
- Knock on your car's hood before you start it as stray cats or other animals may be trying to keep warm in there.

#### 2019 WINTER TAX INFORMATION

Tax bills will be mailed by December 1<sup>st</sup>. Please check your bill upon receipt for possible errors. Errors may be corrected at the **December Board of Review, Tuesday December 10th at 1:30pm** at the Township Hall.

The Treasurer will collect tax at the <u>Township Office</u> on <u>Tuesdays</u> (9am – 12pm) and Fridays (9am – 4pm) the months of December, January, and February. A 3% penalty will be added to winter tax paid after February 14, 2020. <u>Payment must be received by due date</u>, postmarks are not honored.

Unpaid Summer 2019 tax must be paid at the Township (interest added 1% per month beginning September 15, 2019). Beginning March 2, 2020, unpaid taxes (Summer & Winter) become delinquent and must be paid to the <u>ALLEGAN COUNTY TREASURER</u>, with an additional 4% penalty and 1.% interest per month. Verify the correct amount to be paid by contacting the County Treasurer's Office at 673-0260 or <u>www.allegancounty.org</u>.

## Defer penalty and interest

Qualifying senior citizens or permanently disabled persons may defer penalty and interest on tax payments until April 30<sup>th</sup> for **Homeowner's Principal Residence only**. Notify the Township Treasurer to apply for a **Deferment Application** at the receipt of your tax bill.

Qualified Veterans Exemption: In order to receive this exemption the veteran or widow must file the application annually.
