## LEE TOWNSHIP BEGINS WORK ON MASTER PLAN

For the past year, the Lee Township board has held special meetings to discuss the need for a township Master Plan. This document will help guide the current board, as well as future boards, in making decisions and provide the framework needed when attempting to secure grant funds for improvement projects. Below is the executive summary of the broad township goals identified through the special meetings. The full draft of the plan can be found on the Lee Township website www.leetwp.org.

Work sessions for community input are scheduled for: Monday June 19 and Monday August 7 @ 6:30pm at the Township Hall.

### **Executive Summary**

The Lee Township Master Plan is a basic plan prepared as a foundation for the Township's near and mid-term planning. Although this Plan may include specific land use policies or proposes specific land use arrangements, it has no regulatory power. It provides the basis and impetus, however, needed to support future regulations.

This Plan is expected to be modified and improved as community input made via printed surveys and discussion at focus group and other public meetings is gathered. Lee Township is predominantly rural area and experiencing very little commercial, residential, or industrial development at the present time. Key issues which generally emerge from Township-wide public forums such as public ordinance and zoning support will be paramount to the dialogue.

That being said it is the Township's goal to act on a plan that includes:

- \* Maintain and improve upon the fiscal strength of the Township.
- Promote a safe and inclusive community.
- \* Improves upon roads and basic infrastructure.
- \* Improves access to necessary services that allow residents to work and thrive.
- \* Protection of the Township's natural amenities like lakes, and wetlands.
- \* Encourages business growth.

In its present state, the plan is a working document which will serve the Township board, committees and public interests in future planning and decision making.

### Cemetery

Grave sites must be kept within the rules that are posted in the cemetery and are available in print at the Township office. All decorations (artificial flower, plastic baskets, etc.) placed upon lots that become unsightly, will be removed without notice. All artificial decorations will be removed during spring and fall clean up.

### **General Township Information**

Lee Township borders are 60th Street, 48th Street, Baseline Road and 112th Avenue, encompassing 23,040 acres, and the 2000 Census reported a population of 4,114. Lee Township is home to Pullman Elementary School; Lower Scott Lake (township park and beach, public boat access); Upper Scott Lake (public boat access); Osterhout Lake (public beach and boat access); Lester Lake, Clear Lake; Springbrook Lake; and Middle Branch of the Black River. Lee Township Cemetery is located at 53rd and 105th Ave.

### **SUMMER 2017 TAX INFORMATION**

The Treasurer will collect tax at the <u>Township Office</u> on <u>Fridays (9 AM-12 PM & 1-5 PM)</u> the months of July, August and September. Interest will be added to taxes paid after <u>September 14th. POSTMARKS NOT HONORED</u>. Summer Tax 2017 must be paid to Lee Township Treasurer until February 28, 2018.

Summer deferment Form may be filed to defer payment of interest on principal residence of persons 62 years of age or older or property that is classified or used as agricultural property until the time that winter taxes are due. Forms are available at the Township office, www.leetwp.org and www.allegancounty.org. The form must be filed with the Township Treasurer by September 15, 2017.

For Disabled Veterans Exemption call the Township office or get the form from our website at www.leetwp.org.

The Assessor has authorized the Board of Review to convene on <u>July 18th at 3:00pm</u>. July BOR is to correct any mutual mistake of fact or clerical errors on tax notice. <u>Notify the Treasurer or Assessor of any necessary corrections upon receipt of tax bill.</u>
